

Districting Timeline

Step	Description	
Publish Initial Map February 22	Publish starting point map for public review prior to public hearings.	
First Public Hearing March 1, 6pm	First public hearing - Demographer will give presentation on mapping requirements and introduce use of public mapping tool for public to submit maps. Council take public testimony. Newhall Community Center, 22421 Market St., Newhall, CA 91321	
Initial Public Map Deadline April 3	Any resident-drawn proposed maps must be submitted by April 3 to be considered at the April 13 th public hearing.	
Public Maps Posted Online April 6	Demographer publishes public maps on website.	
Second Public Hearing April 13, 6pm	Second public hearing. Council provides direction to demographer regarding any changes to starting point map based upon public map submissions and public testimony.	
Final Public Map Deadline April 21	Revised public generated maps due to the demographer.	
Public Maps Posted Online April 26	Demographer publishes public maps on website.	
Third Public Hearing May 1, 6pm	Third Public Hearing. Possible City Council first reading of the ordinance adopting the Council District Map. City Council Chambers: 23920 Valencia Blvd., Santa Clarita, CA 91355	
Potential Map adoption May 23, 6pm	At the regular City Council meeting the Council may conduct the second reading of the ordinance adopting the Council District Map. Regular City Council Meeting at City Council Chambers: 23920 Valencia Blvd., Santa Clarita, CA 91355	

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Districting Rules and Goals

1. Federal Laws

Equal Population Federal Voting Rights Act No Racial Gerrymandering



2. California Criteria for Cities

- 1. Geographically contiguous
- 2. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest"

(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)

- 3. Easily identifiable boundaries
- Compact

 (Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

Prohibited:

"Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party."


3. Settlement Agreement

Remedy map must include one district tailored to "give Latinos ... the best opportunity to influence the outcome of City Council elections."

4. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles

Respect voters' choices / continuity in office

Future population growth



April 13 Direction & New Public Input

- Council requested to see a map revising the Joint Draft Map to incorporate the neighborhood fixes proposed in Map 107 plus the additional neighborhood fixes mentioned by NDC at the meeting.
 This is Map 110.
- Council requested to see another version of that map including only the sub-set of changes that plaintiffs agreed were improvements to the map.
 - After the second hearing, plaintiffs' counsel refused to support the original joint draft map or the joint draft map revised to include the agreed-upon improvements.


One resident submitted two new map proposals, which were posted as Map 111 and Map 112.
