

Capital Improvement Program Overview

Santa Clarita's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is a component of the annual budget process that addresses the City's short- and long-term capital needs. Just as important, the CIP emphasizes a plan of action that effectively maintains the existing infrastructure to a sound physical standard, as well as providing new facilities to support current growth and complement new development.

The Five-Year CIP is a decision-making tool that provides the City Council, staff, and residents with an opportunity to identify and prioritize significant infrastructure needs for the community. The preparation of the Annual CIP Budget is a collaborative effort that encompasses several components.

Every year, the community and City staff have an opportunity to submit potential capital projects for review and consideration. The City Engineer analyzes each potential project in order to develop cost estimates for each project. Concurrent with this effort, the City Treasurer reviews the City's financial position in order to determine potential revenues available to fund new projects. Once this process has been completed, the recommended CIP Budget is presented to the City Manager's Office for consideration, and ultimately approval by the City Council.

Throughout this entire process, several key factors are utilized to assist staff and the City Council in prioritizing projects, including:

- Relation to Community Strategic Planning goals and other significant development and/or planning efforts.
- Projects previously budgeted in the City's Five-Year CIP.


- Projects that reduce ongoing operational costs.
- Projects that have committed outside funds that are specifically tied to a particular proposal.

The City of Santa Clarita typically finances its capital projects through a combination of revenues. The proposed resources that will be used to support the Fiscal Year 2000-01 CIP are outlined in the CIP Summaries section of this document.

The proposed CIP consists of improvements and projects totaling \$40,634,993 is distributed among the following project categories:
