Capital Improvement Program Overview

The Five-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget is a decision-making tool that provides the City Council, staff, and residents with an opportunity to identify and prioritize significant infrastructure needs for the community.

Santa Clarita's CIP Budget is a component of the annual budget process that addresses the City's short- and long-term capital needs. Beginning this fiscal year, the City will introduce the concept of identifying proposed multi-year funding to the CIP Budget process. The introduction of an internal strategy represents an opportunity to integrate the capital project priorities of staff and the City Council with anticipated Early identification of these revenues. priority projects with projected revenues allows for critical examination of staff and Council goals, ensuring a realistic and sound projected capital budget.

As in each year, the community and City staff have an opportunity to submit potential capital projects for review and consideration. As the budget process unfolds the City Engineer analyzes each potential project in order to develop cost estimates for each project, while the City Treasurer reviews the City's financial position in order to determine potential revenues available to fund new projects. Once this process has been completed, the recommended CIP Budget is presented by the City Manager to the City Council for their review, consideration, and ultimate approval.

Throughout this entire process, several key factors are utilized in prioritizing and preparing the proposed budget to the City Council, including:

- Relation to Community Strategic Planning goals and other significant development and/or planning efforts.
- Projects previously budgeted in the City's Five-year CIP.
- Projects that reduce ongoing operational costs.

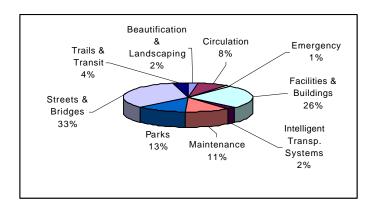
 Projects that have committed outside funds that are specifically tied to a particular proposal.
