💶 are just a few months into the new year and things are already are just a rew months into the restrictions are looking brighter! Here in Santa Clarita the COVID-19 restrictions are lifting and the City has already cut the ribbon on a newly renovated amenity. On April 12, 2021, the City Council welcomed the community to The Cube – Ice and Entertainment in Santa Clarita.

This massive 93,000 square foot facility located at 27745 Smyth Drive has been repainted, rebranded and renovated to once again welcome ice skaters, hockey players and all other ice athletes. The Cube has three sheets of ice an NHL rink, Olympic rink and the smaller Pond. Although it is a City-owned facility, Santa Clarita has teamed up with the LA Kings and American Sports Entertainment Company to handle the day to day operations.

The facility had shutdown in March 2020, due to the Los Angeles County Public Health orders, and the owners put it up for sale. The ice-skating community reached out to the City, urging them to purchase the facility to preserve the vital local amenity. The City Council approved the purchase and staff got to work bringing the facility up to City standards.

In addition to ice sports, The Cube will also host a wide range of events including non-profit fundraisers, concerts, conventions, business meetings, banquets, mixers and much more. Small groups can take advantage of the freshly revamped Top Shelf. Located on the second floor, the Top Shelf is a banquet room with fresh white floors and cool blue walls, which opens up to a picturesque balcony with spectacular views of the valley. This space will be ideal for business mixers and meetings. For bigger events, an insulated floor can be placed over the ice, creating a huge space for banquets, galas and other gatherings.

We are working to procure the items to support the multitude of events The Cube can host. The City looks forward to welcoming residents to utilize The Cube for events and appreciates their patience as we put all the pieces in place to make it a superior experience. Sheriff's Captain

Santa Clarita Valley Sheriff's Station Deputies continue to remain vigilant and proactive in order to provide the highest safety and security for our entire community. In 2020, we saw an overwhelming outreach of community support for the men and women of our Station. This unprecedented support was complemented by partnering with the community and achieving the lowest Part 1 crime rate on record.

As more establishments begin to open, deputies will be conducting additional target-specific crime suppression operations focused on theft, DUI, traffic enforcement, narcotics activity and more. In Los Angeles County, we saw an overall 400% increase of reported catalytic converter thefts during 2020. In March 2021, the Santa Clarita Valley Station Crime Impact Team (CIT) led a search warrant operation in the City of Los Angeles as a proactive approach to combat catalytic converter thefts. CIT personnel identified multiple locations in L.A. linked to thefts occurring throughout the Santa Clarita Valley. The large-scale operation resulted in the recovery of 250 catalytic converters, one "ghost gun" and 19 arrests.

This increase led to the Santa Clarita Valley Sheriff's Station partnering with "Reeve's Complete Auto Center" for two catalytic converter etching events. These events provided an opportunity for residents to have the license plate number of their vehicle etched onto the catalytic converter. This helps deputies locate the original owner in the event the converter is stolen and recovered.

As we progress into 2021, we face new challenges related to a large increase in repeat criminal offenders. Deputies will be working hard to curve crime through the use of data analysis and target specific crime suppression operations.

We will continue monitoring crime trends with a goal of reduction, prevention and community involvement. We encourage our community members to report suspicious activities directly to the station, Crime Stoppers (lacrimestoppers.org) or by calling (800) 222-TIPS. a message from the Assistant **Fire Chief** Anderson Mackey

Los Angeles County firefighters and paramedics have heard all too often, "I only looked away for just a few seconds!" Unfortunately, that's all it takes for a child to drown. Drowning accidents are a leading cause of death for children one to four years of age. Almost 70% of all drowning accidents occur in backyard swimming pools, and all of those accidents could have been prevented. Please follow these simple rules when trying to stay safe (and cool!) during hot summer days.

- Never take your eyes off a child when he or she is in or near any body of water, even for a second.
- Don't rely solely on barriers, such as fences or walls near a pool or spa. There is no substitute for constant supervision.
- Keep toys, tricycles and other children's playthings out of the water and away from the pool or spa.
- Don't consider your children to be "drown-proof" because you enrolled them in swimming classes.
- Don't rely on inflatable devices to keep your child afloat. These are not substitutes for adult supervision.
- Always drain standing (surface) water from the pool cover. Remember that even a few inches of water can be hazardous, especially to young children.

If a child or adult is in trouble in a pool, please remember ...Don't panic! Get the child/adult out of the pool immediately, yell for help, call 911 immediately and begin CPR if necessary. If you are not already trained in CPR, the Fire Department dispatcher will provide instructions over the phone.

The Los Angeles County Fire Department wants everyone to remember to exercise caution and safety during any recreational water activity. Remember, the next time you are by the pool, just a few seconds is all it takes for a life to be lost to this preventable tragedy.
