Some of the accolades bestowed upon the City of Santa Clarita in the past year include the Annual Achievement of Excellence in Procurement Award, Project of the Year Award from the Southern California Chapter of the American Public Works Association for the Canyon County Inclusive Play Area, National Association of Volunteer Programs in Local Government Rising to Excellence Award winner, designated a Tree City USA for the 31st year and ranked in the top seven percent of fiscally healthy cities, just to name a few. In addition, the City of Santa Clarita has the distinct honor of winning the most Helen Putnam Awards of Excellence from the League of California Cities. This year also saw City Manager Ken Striplin honored with the prestigious 2021 Award for Career Excellence by the International City/County Management Association.

Santa Clarita continues to top the lists of national rankings for a variety of quality-of-life themes. This year our City was named the 4th Most Ambitious City in America by Verizon, was ranked in the Top 10 Safest Cities in the Nation by three national organizations and was recognized as one of the Happiest and Healthiest Cities in the Nation by WalletHub.

Throughout 2021, the City of Santa Clarita has continued to make new amenities available to the community while supporting those hit hardest by the pandemic. The Shop Local/Eat **Local** campaign encouraged residents to support our local businesses, while the Rental Assistance Program distributed millions of dollars to those behind on rent due to COVID-19. This year also saw the reopening and rebranding of the The Cube - Ice and Entertainment Center, which is owned by the City and operated by ASEC and the LA Kings. Old Town Newhall welcomed dozens of new businesses, including the new Laemmle Theatre, bringing art-house and film festival winners alongside current blockbuster movies. We encouraged residents to get outdoors with new hiking trails and trailheads, providing residents additional ways to explore our thousands of acres

of pristine open space.

In addition to the regular updating and enhancing of City infrastructure through our

These convenient services returned in 2021 after a brief hiatus due to the pandemic. These new City amenities will bring enhanced enrichment, activities and safety to our residents.

After three years, construction is complete and the brand-new Canyon Country Community Center is now open to the public! The Canyon Country Community Center, which is located on the northeast corner of Soledad Canyon Road and Sierra Highway, is a destination for residents throughout the City to enjoy cultural programming, community events, recreational opportunities and much more. In addition to a number of public art pieces, the Community Center also features a large outdoor event space, playground with sensory elements, a full gymnasium, space for fitness classes and after-school programming and a demonstration teaching kitchen. The Santa Clarita Valley Sheriff's Station is Complete!

The brand-new, state-of-the-art Santa Clarita Valley Sheriff's Station, located on Golden Valley Road between Robert C. Lee Parkway and Centre Pointe Parkway, is now complete and will soon be fully operational. The 46,000-square-foot station provides the Sheriff's Department with the space and resources it needs to deliver the high level of service Santa Clarita Valley residents expect. The new station includes a detached vehicle maintenance facility, a heliport, a 9-1-1 dispatch center, a detention center and space for the Department's local Emergency Operations Center. This project was a joint effort with Los Angeles County Fifth District Supervisor Kathryn Barger and is a piece of critical infrastructure that will positively impact Santa Clarita for decades to come.

A MESSAGE FROM THE SHERIFF'S CAPTAIN JUSTIN DIEZ

Despite the challenges of the last 18 months, I am proud of the resolve and dedication demonstrated by the men and women of Santa Clarita Valley Sheriff's Station. They have continued to honorably serve our SCV community through the COVID-19 pandemic, Department budget cuts and new criminal justice polices and directives, which have had a significant impact on our day to day jobs.

We have seen a major spike in the number of repeat offenders, some who have been arrested more than 20 times in the last year and a half. These repeat offenders account for nearly 40 percent of our total arrests. New criminal justice policies and directives have enabled criminals to repeatedly break the law and perpetuate crime throughout our neighborhoods.

Even with these obstacles, I am proud to say, that Santa Clarita remains one of the safest cities in the nation. In the first half of 2021, burglaries in Santa Clarita were down almost 40 percent compared to the same time period in 2020. Additionally, there are fewer collisions and injuries on our streets, with total collisions down 17 percent and collisions resulting in injury down 15 percent.

The team at the Santa Clarita Valley Station is also looking forward to moving into our new facility on Golden Valley Road. The current facility on Magic Mountain Parkway was built nearly five decades ago and since then, the population of our valley has grown exponentially. As our station staffing needs also grew, we were forced to lease additional space, as well as set up modular buildings in our parking lot.

Now, we are beginning to make the move to the brand-new Santa Clarita Valley Sheriff's Station, which will offer the space and resources for our Station staff to best serve the needs of the community now, and well into the future.

Santa Clarita Olympians Shine in Tokyo

This Summer, six Santa Clarita natives competed in the Olympic and Paralympic Games at Tokyo 2020. Allyson Felix completed her fifth trip to the Olympics by bringing home two more medals, making her the most decorated United States track athlete in Olympic history. By winning bronze in the 400m and gold in the 4x400m Relay, Felix now has 11 Olympic medals in her career, including seven gold, three silver and one bronze.

In her second Olympics, swimmer **Abbey Weitzeil** won a pair of medals for Team USA. Weitzeil returned to Santa Clarita with a bronze medal from the 4x100m Freestyle Relay and a silver medal from the 4x100m Medley Relay. Paralympic archer Kevin Mather excelled in his first trip to the Paralympics, winning gold in the Men's Individual Recurve Open. Mather defeated both the #1 and #2 seeds in the tournament to claim the top prize.

Kyle Ensing and David Smith represented Team USA in Volleyball, helping the country to hard-fought victories over France and Tunisia. Brittany Cervantes represented Team Mexico in Softball. leading the team offensively and securing the country's first Olympic victory in the sport.

Homelessness Update

The City of Santa Clarita continues to partner with our local non-profits to help our neighbors experiencing homelessness. This fall, Family Promise broke ground on a new transitional and affordable housing project on land transferred from the City at no cost. In addition, Bridge to Home is wrapping up its Capital Campaign to build a permanent shelter on land also donated by the City. Returning in 2022 is the annual Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count, which was canceled in 2020 and 2021 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Preparations are underway, and the count will take place in January. As a part of the upcoming Homeless Count, the Los Angeles Homeless Authority (LAHSA) is debuting a mobile app for the point-in-time count rather than the traditional clipboard tally sheets. MESSAGE FROM THE ASST. FIRE CHIEF *ANDERSON* MACKEY

While we continue to return to normalcy slowly and, in some cases, what will inevitably be a new normal for many, the Los Angeles County Fire Department has never wavered in its commitment to provide emergency services at standards that the community has come to expect. Equally as important, our Department is pleased that we have recently been able to re-engage with the community through participation in a variety of community events.

We are also proud to announce the launch of our newest public education program, Sirens of Silence. The Sirens of Silence program was created by our Department in collaboration with and vetted by parents, advocates, clinicians/therapists, educators and physicians who work with individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), to bring awareness and foster inclusivity to this growing population with special needs.

The program consists of three components: 1) education and awareness for the Department's first responders through a mandatory training module as well as access to visual aids and informational materials with advice and practical tips on how to approach, respond and communicate; 2) safety-related items (e.g., seatbelt covers, sensory toys, etc.) for special needs patients; and 3) special needs-friendly events for residents to meet and interact with first responders in a welcoming and sensory-sensitive space. Children with ASD and their parents can become more familiar with first responders and their equipment, thereby increasing their comfort levels.

In closing, we remind you that we are still in the midst of the brush fire season; we are hopeful that everyone has prepared themselves and their home by utilizing our Ready! Set! Go! Wildfire Action Plan. If you have not yet done so, please visit fire.lacounty.gov/rsg.


shopping in Valencia, grab a bite to eat in Canyon Country and more!
